How do I sign up for direct deposit?

Answer

If you already receive Social Security or SSI benefits and you have a bank account, you can sign up for Direct Deposit by completing one of the following four steps:

- Obtaining a password and starting or changing direct deposit online at <http://www.socialsecurity.gov/icdd/> (Social Security benefits only), **or**
- Contacting any Farmers State Bank location, **or**
- Calling Social Security toll-free at 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778), **or**
- Filling out a Direct Deposit Sign Up Form at <http://www.socialsecurity.gov/deposit/1199a.pdf> and taking it to any Farmers State Bank location or Social Security office.

When you contact us, be sure to have your Social Security number and a personal check or statement from your new account. We will need information from these documents to start your new direct deposit. Also, we recommend that you wait until deposits are going to your new bank, savings and loan or credit union before you close your old account.
